New Catskill Conservation Corps Offers First Training for Volunteers

The newly formed Catskill Conservation Corps, a partnership between the New York-New Jersey Trail Conference and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, invites potential trail volunteers to its first event: a **Volunteer Leadership Training workshop** scheduled for Saturday, August 9, at the beautifully restored former Ulster & Delaware Railroad station on the Mountain Top Historical Society campus in Haines Falls. The workshop will be led by experienced volunteer trail leaders of the New York-New Jersey Trail Conference.

This free, one-day workshop is a great opportunity to sharpen your leadership skills and learn how to manage volunteers. It is open to anyone interested in learning more about how to lead volunteers on volunteer stewardship activities in the Catskill Park.

- Develop skills to effectively manage maintainers from recruitment to recognition;
- Learn about on-the-ground and off-trail responsibilities activities; and
- Develop and tap into resources to solve problems on and off the trails.

Hands-on exercises and discussions will provide information to find solutions to problems that supervisors commonly face.

Light refreshments and snacks will be served throughout the day, but participants should bring a bag lunch. The workshop will be held rain or shine.
